WELCOME

No Christian is solitary. Through baptism we become members one of another in Christ, members of a company of saints whose mutual belonging transcends death:

One family, we dwell in him, one Church, above, beneath; though now divided by the stream, the narrow stream of death. (Charles Wesley)

All Saints' Day and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on All Souls' Day both celebrate this mutual belonging. All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives the Church as a whole has seen the grace of God powerfully at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for that grace, and for the wonderful ends to which it shapes a human life; it is a time to be encouraged by the example of the saints and to recall that sanctity may grow in the ordinary circumstances, as well as the extraordinary crises, of human living. It allows us to remember with thanksgiving before God those whom we have known more directly: those who gave us life, or who nurtured us in faith.

Today we give thanks for the saints who have gone before us, for the saints of God who are living, and for saints still to come. We are especially thankful for the witness and works of those who have died in the faith as they modeled what it means to be both saint and sinner. Today we remember especially those who died in the past year.

Let us for a moment remember those who have done so much for the church here in the Pas-de-Calais – and if you have a candle to hand you may like to light it now in remembrance of them: those who brightened our services with their music Robin, Roy, Charles ... those here who led us in our worship Bob, or crossed the Channel in all weathers to do so Father William, Tony Rimmer, Andrew Marke, Gordon Manley, Michael Fulljames and Alan Duke, those who drove from one end of the chaplaincy to the other to support the congregations in their worship, Georges and Mary, those who fought to bring about social change, Bill, those who organised social events Roland, Tina, Tony and those who were always there supporting us: Henry, Georges, Alice, Denise, Dora, Ron, Paul ... the list is long and I am well aware I may have forgotten some so if you would now like to name them aloud, or name name a family member please do so now ...

Leader: For all those in our own lives who have revealed to us the love of God

and shown to us the way of holiness, we give you thanks.

We look forward to sharing with them the life that is eternal.

Rest eternal grant them, O Lord, and let light perpetual shine upon them.

First Reading

Revelation 7:9-17

7:9 After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands.

7:10 They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!"

7:11 And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God,

7:12 singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

7:13 Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where

have they come from?"

7:14 I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

7:15 For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.

7:16 They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat;

Reflections

This weekend we celebrate two days in the church calendar, All Saints' Day and All Souls' day. Today we often know more about Halloween than these two religious festivals. This time last year we were in Austin Texas, where you could be forgiven for thinking that October 31st was all about pumpkins, ghosts and witches and Trick or Treat. But All Saints' Day itself was to remember those who are saints, those who had gone before us, those who had died. It was originally held to remember those saints whose names weren't known but who had died for their faith – such was their belief in Jesus Christ that even when their lives were threatened, they died for what they believe in: the unknown martyrs

Today's reflections comes with love and prayers from the Scargill community in North Yorkshire – which is supported by Vaughan and Hilary, two members of the Boulogne congregation . The reflection is based on the last verse of the first reading from Revelations

'For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.' Rev 7. 17

At Scargill, life, as it has been for everybody, has been challenging, uncertain, with no one knowing what the future holds. Whether we are living in North Yorkshire or Northern France we are all in for a tough and long winter.

So how does All Saints' Day give us hope, encouragement and love?

A clue is in the day itself – it is ALL – SAINTS.

It is a day, where we are reminded that in Jesus Christ we are mysteriously and wonderfully connected, not just across the English Channel, with our friends in the UK and Scargill, but with those who have gone before us. Hebrews 12.1 tells us — 'Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us,'

This is such an encouraging verse – we are not alone, in Christ, in his love, peace and joy we are together; together with the saints that have gone before, cheering us on, with those of us running the race with perseverance.

And in a wonderful way, by the gift of the Holy Spirit the Scargill community and the church here in Northern France are connected. We are brothers and sisters in Christ. So we can pray for one another, and encourage one another.

And we are all in need of prayer. The race we are currently in is over very challenging terrain, and we really don't know the way through it, and it feels like a marathon that just seems to go on....and on....and on.

Perseverance is most definitely needed and this is nurtured by the love of the saints who, when we stumble, can pick us up, dust us down, and run alongside us. Who have been those saints for us during these unprecedented days? Let us pause for a moment and gives thanks to God for them,

The NT reading for today is from Revelation; It is full of hope. It speaks of Jesus the Lamb at the centre, it speaks of Jesus the Shepherd who leads us to springs of water.

Yet isn't this a bit difficult to understand? Jesus is the Lamb and the Shepherd! What does that mean? How does it encourage us on this All Saints Day?

A couple of thoughts on this:

We are saints through the grace of God – It is in Jesus that we are saints – Jesus, the one who John says comes with 'grace upon grace'. Jesus shows us the love of the Father. He shows us what his loving Father is like – never more than on the cross. The Lamb that was slain. The Lamb full of grace, forgiveness, and calls us his children. We are saints, never by our own endeavours, but by his grace – freely given, undeserved.

And Jesus is the Shepherd. There are literally thousands of sheep in the Yorkshire Dales. The local farmer when he comes into the reception at Scargill you know he is there because he smells...he smells of his sheep. Jesus the Shepherd smells of his sheep, because he is *with* us. Jesus says in John 10:14 'I'm the Good Shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me'. In the current circumstances we can feel quite lost — but we are reminded that the Good Shepherd comes looking for us. We are his, and whatever circumstances we face we cannot be snatched from his love.

And finally he is the one- 'who leads us to springs of water' – Through the Holy Spirit how would Jesus use us this week to bring hope to another? To be a spring of water? What would an act of kindness look like for you? And who to?

As Saints we reflect the life of Jesus, the Lamb and Shepherd, and in these 'dry and arid' days, how can we be springs of water? How can we show the compassion and tenderness of Jesus? Yes - to be truly saintly!

So let us give thanks for all those who have gone before us – for those who made us what and who we are today – and let us work together with the grace of God to bring God's kingdom here where we are in the Pas-de-Calais.
