The Merry Month of May

May, the month we associate with bursting new life in the countryside. The signs of renewal and growth are all around us.

Not surprisingly, there are several days in this revitalising month marking important public holidays and celebrations, some with greater spiritual significance than others.

Following the ancient festival of May Day, we have in France on 8th May 'la fête de la victoire' commemorating the end of World War II in Europe. In France, unlike the UK, it is a major public holiday. The third public holiday in May, and one of the most important dates in the French Christian calendar, is of course Ascension Day. This is forty days after Easter, commemorating the day on which Jesus Christ ascended to Heaven after his resurrection. Thus, like Easter, it is a "movable feast" even though it always falls on a Thursday. This year it falls on 26th May. While a normal working day in the UK, as is VE Day, in France Ascension Day is marked by church services in most towns and cities. It is commemorated everywhere as an opportunity to spend time with family and friends, or simply to enjoy the spring weather after the rigours of winter. Because it falls on a Thursday, many French people choose to 'faire le pont', make a long weekend of it.

Finally, on 29th May, France celebrates 'la fête des mères', Mother's Day. Apparently, the last Sunday in May, was decreed as a day of celebration by Napoleon to encourage the French to have more children! It corresponds of course to the UK Mothering Sunday, which was commemorated in Lent, this year on 27th March.

So many blessings and fine events to celebrate in "the merry month of May". Michael Spriggs

A Brief History of the Orchestra.

The members of 'Vignolle Ensemble' come from various Dutch student orchestras. They have no professional experience in music, but play in the orchestra alongside their studies or work. Over the past ten years, the 'Vignolle Ensemble' has given numerous concerts, including twenty-seven in the North of France (including the Abbey of Valloires, Boulogne-sur-Mer,

Abbeville and Hesdin), twenty-five in the Netherlands and three in England. Due to the covid-19 pandemic, Vignolle's last visit to France was in September 2019. *The 'Vignolle Ensemble' wishes to inspire and connect people through music. The orchestra is conducted by conductor Eduardus Lee (1987).

Gathering at the Association Hall for 11 a.m.

Return by procession to the Association Hall

Pass cemetery on left and take 1st left – rue du Marais; Association Hall on right at end.
