Bishop Robert, Bishop of Gibraltar in Europe, said:

"Bishop David's retirement will leave a huge hole in the diocese. We will miss his vast knowledge, mature experience and personal friendship. These days, senior roles in the Church are extremely demanding, arguably all the more so in our diocese with the demands of frequent international travel. The Church therefore owes Bishop David an immense debt of gratitude for more than two decades of devoted episcopal service.

"He has supported and encouraged the diocese and its chaplaincies through numerous international crises: banking, sovereign debt, migration, Brexit and Covid. At the level of individual chaplaincies, he has overseen numerous recruitments of chaplains, baptized and confirmed hundreds of candidates, advised on mission initiatives and building projects, dealt with situations of conflict, and exercised a highly skilled ministry of oversight so as to build up the faith of individuals and communities. "Bishop David is a skilled ecumenist. He has, for example, served as co-chair of the International Anglican Roman Catholic Commission for Unity and Mission, the chair of the Church of England's Porvoo Panel, which serves the links between Anglicans and Scandinavian and Baltic Lutherans and President of the Society of St. Willibrord, which brings together Anglicans and Old Catholics. A proficient linguist, Bishop David has nurtured personal relationships with ecumenical colleagues for the good of the whole Church. He retires with prayers and love from across our diocese."

Once Bishop David retires, the process to seek to appoint the next suffragan Bishop in Europe will begin. Bishop Robert, Bishop of Gibraltar in Europe

"All the family were able to attend the funeral for which I was very pleased as my nephews travelled from Liverpool and others from central UK. All of dad's French choir were there to sing and it was very moving. He is buried with mum at Willencourt".

We in Hesdin remember them both with great fondness.

Pauline was always available and happy to support the treasurer and Frank who was our resident music provider, led us with his wonderful strong voice, in the singing of hymns and Psalms, meticulously chosen by him, for each Sunday service.


Some of Franks favourite hymns, chosen by Daphne, were sung by the congregation; and church members who knew him well took the readings.

## A Group of Eccentric Englishmen ...

Each year in spring, I join a group of eccentric Englishmen (*is there any other kind?*), who set out on a cycling tour of the WWI battlefields of northern France and Belgium. The group, mainly former employees of the same British enterprise, will meet this time for the event's 25th anniversary expedition.

The idea arose all those years ago when senior management decided a team-building exercise would

do the up-and-coming executives a power of good. They made available generous funds and left it to the chosen participants to decide what it should involve. Thus, it was that in April 1999 this intrepid group set off to Lille with their bicycles on the Eurostar; and then cycled "over the top"

On return, they agreed that the whole event had been so rewarding that they would repeat it each spring. Since then, it has evolved to the point where all now come across in a hired bus, loaded with bikes. All levels of fitness and inclinations are catered for. So, with careful – almost military – planning, each day begins with all being transported to a jumping off point. The Lycra-clad cyclists set off for their 30km morning trail. The walkers follow a shorter, gentler route; while the third group prefers to stay on board and view from the comfort of the bus. Then cleverly, all three groups meet up at a predetermined point and time for a leisurely lunch at some rustic brasserie.

Over the years, numbers have gradually shifted from the first group (cyclists) to the second (walkers); and more recently into the group of bus-pass holders.

The camaraderie remains intense, flavoured with mischievous English humour, pranks, fines for misdemeanours, etc: most of us do not see each other from one year to the next, and yet on meeting are able to greet each other with:" As I was saying last year!"



At the same time, we are all deeply respectful of what we see and visit. The 45km-stretch of land between Beaumont-Hamel and Chaulnes, the theatre for the Battle of the Somme, is visited most often. The whole area still bears many signs of that terrible campaign, in which over a million men were killed or wounded. The CWG Commission maintains immaculately dozens of cemeteries and memorials in the area, most notably the incredibly moving structures at Thiepval and Vimy Ridge.

Cycling through this now peaceful rural area, it is hard to imagine the nightmare of that era; and yet reminders are everywhere. Every year, local farmers plough up tons of unexploded shells; and I have found all sorts of wartime debris: shell cases, rifle parts, bullets.




