

 David was a well-known and long-standing member of the Calais congregation who rarely missed a service with his wife Pat and daughter Clare. He fulfilled the role of treasurer for a number of years.

David was born in February 1942, the eldest of three children, and was raised in Essex. He went to St Edmund's public school in Canterbury before starting his first job as a buyer for Butlins holiday camps, purchasing stuffed animal heads for the bars in the Minehead camp!

David's career then took quite an international turn when he and the family moved to Egypt for a position working for the tunnel under the Suez Canal, before moving to Saudia Arabia.

He was also a purchaser on projects in Poland, Peru, Nigeria and the UK, before moving to France to work for a Lebanese company. David's last position bought him to the Nord-Pas-de-Calais where he worked for TML and latterly Eurotunnel.

When David retired, he volunteered at the Seamans Club in Calais, offering companionship to those at sea temporarily docked in Calais port. He also enjoyed singing bass in the Calais choir "Arpege" for several years.

During the 70s, David designed and built two semi-detached houses, using very modern products.

He and Pat were married for 60 years and raised four children together. He was also a keen dog-walker.

David was well-known in the family for his puns and was particularly proud of his bilingual ones. I am sure many of us have witnessed this talent over the years!

One chaplaincy member reflected,

"David was always the first to jump in and help (less jumping in later years!), he always had a smile and said some of the nicest and kindest things to me."

The Reverend Sara MacVane, very kindly, came to Calais to lead a touching 'Service of Celebration' of David's life, which was attended by many family members who'd travelled from the UK and Australia; the service was also attended by his friends and members of the Anglican community in the Pas de Calais Chaplaincy.

David will be greatly missed by all those who had the pleasure of knowing him!

Cecchin's home. Pauline who's Boulogne's churchwarden, said



An Update on the Virtual Lent Walk

Over the period of Lent several members of the Pas de Calais chaplaincy and their friends and family set themselves a challenge to walk from the Porte de Calais, the gateway leading to the Basilica of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception at Boulogne-Sur-Mer to the Christchurch gate leading to Canterbury Cathedral. The group found that walking was good for their wellbeing but were also fundraising to support the Maria Skobtsova (MS) House in Calais which offers sanctuary and hospitality to vulnerable refugees and in particular women and children. To find out more about the work of the MS House please visit this link: https://www.refugeehousecalais.org/home After the first week it became clear that the group would surpass the initial challenge of 108 kms. They did! The final remarkable distance walked was 904kms. Virtual visits to our three congregations and group members were added, including a visit to Linda in the South of France.

Sponsored by one of the group's son's butchers BOS family butchers which is described by Le Petit Futé 2025 as "without doubt one of the best butchers of Montmartre"

With their help, and donations from others, 330 euros have been raised in aid of the MS House so far...

He has also been conductor of the Devon Symphony Orchestra, Oswestry Sinfonia, Midlands Festival Orchestra, Shrewsbury Choral Society and founder of the Shrewsbury Cantata Choir. He presented a weekly programme on BBC Radio Shropshire "The Classical Hour" for 4 years.

Living in France for the past 20 years he is currently conductor of the choir "Albert Laurent" of Abbeville, his professional chamber choir "Ensemble H.3" which has performed four times in Saint Pol and his orchestra "Concertante 62".

Jeff Ward lives in Hampshire, England, and began his musical journey as a teenager playing oboe and piano, then keyboards in progressive rock bands. In the 1980s he became a sound engineer and producer, running his own recording studio in London. A career change to insurance technology lasted 30 years until the Covid19 pandemic when the call of creativity and music during the long lockdowns became too strong to resist, and he tried composing and discovered he loved it. Since then, it has become something of an obsession, and he has written several works for choir, chamber and symphony orchestras. His Cello Concerto Op. 17, written at the age of 63, is his largest and most complex work to date and the first to be

performed in public. But don't worry, music lovers!
